Economic Impact	Updated Fiscal Year 2020
Penn's presence (university and health system) generates robust economic activity, including \$21.5B in the 14 county greater Philadelphia region, where it supports 114,350 jobs directly and indirectly. In the Commonwealth of PA, it generates \$20.5B in total annual activity and supports 107,900 jobs directly and indirectly. In Philadelphia, it generates \$15.5B of economic activity annually, which translates to \$42M per day, supporting 80,150 jobs directly and indirectly, which equals to 1 in 8 Philadelphians employed. All schools and centers engaged in hundreds of varied programs supporting public education and health, community development and quality of life; totaling \$46M expenditures, mobilizing 15,600 Penn faculty, students, and staff who work 344,000 hours to civically engage with 718,000 Philadelphians.
